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





Foix castle, a lofty history

This fortress is proudly perched on the highest section of a rocky outcrop overlooking the town. Rebuilt though the ages, it was extended to take up the whole upper part of the rock and is now a symbol of the town.

Learn about the incredible story of the Counts of Foix in the museum. A 2000m2 interactive scenographic space where daily life plays out, love stories unfold and wars break out.

Every room in the castle is adorned with the finery of times gone by, bringing you right into the heart of the middle ages. Its furniture and various weapons sit waiting for the return of their master...and for you!

On the fortress ramparts, you can become a strategist, a knight, a stone mason or even a blacksmith at one of the fun workshops.

With family or friends, the escape game will take you in search of Cathar treasure in the underbelly of the Gaston Fébus' castle.

SAVOIR-FAIRE

The village of Forges de Pyrène: a journey back to 1900

Listen and hear to the secrets shared by the blacksmith at the forge. One of the last original hammer forges time of that's still in use.


Closely tied to the hammer forge, delve into the region's great iron history of the 14th century through a spectacular scenography at the Musée du Fer (iron museum).

A huge collection of tools and objects assembled at the Musée de Métiers (crafts museum), showing 130 skills and techniques of the past. Go back in time to 1900 and tap into the life of Baptistou on an interactive, time framed circuit called "Les âges de vie".

Follow the mascot, Caramel, a mischievous squirrel who will guide you through the typical Ariège way of life, from its flora and fauna to the natural ressources used respectfully by people in their work.



All the unforgotten secrets of village life are revealed through workshops where you can discover the crafts and fashions of the past, a real legacy of our Pyrenean culture.





Labouiche, a subterranean escapade

Discovered by Dr. Dunac in 1908, it's been open to the public since 1938.


Rich in caves, the Ariège river provides some unique experiences like the one below 60 metres underground.

Take a trip on a boat in search of the wizard and the unicorn. Marvel at these ancient geological formations and cruise along the underground waterfalls.

Here, even if the time seems to have stopped, it continues to carry out its work on the limestone formations millimetre by millimetre.

Get on board and explore the wondrous history of this 1500 metre-long river.

The Barguillère valley is for you!


Stop by at the Abbaye Notre Dame du Pesquié in Serres sur Arget to experience some great local products before taking the road towards the village for a picnic and a walk around the lake. Discover the techniques of traditional knife making at the Coutellerie Boisset or pick your own blueberries at the Malpassadou farm. Enjoy our picturesques villages and appreciate the view from Col de Légrillou.

MOSTLY ,

YOU ARE MORE A "MAN AND IRON" TYPE.

For people interested in geology and materials, this is for you!

Start in Ferrières sur Ariège where iron was found in the past, then onwards to the lovely little village of Montgailhard and its "sugar loaf". Learn about quartz craft in the Prayols village or see the mines of Kaolin near Seignaux, walk on the "devil's bridge" between legend and reality and enjoy the fabulous panoramic views of Montoulieu village.



History of the Pech terraces

Just above Foix, strange strips of stone reveal themselves, crossing the landscape and time itself.

Agricultural and pastoral activity popped up here in the 10th century on the westerly slopes of the mountain range. People equipped these terraces with dry stones and cabins to secure the land and make the most of this ideal aspect for developing subsistence cereal agriculture using rainfall to water the crops. It was not always straightforward, this sort of terrain were can be difficult to cultivate.

These days the terraces are protected by the Ariège Pastoral Federation, listed as a Natura 2000 site, and have marked walking trails with information boards describing the daily life of the time and the local flora.

The terraces are also a subject of interest for a group of volunteers who are rebuilding some of the terraced areas and making stone benches to preserve this local heritage and its rich history. You may even be lucky enough to cross paths with Richard Danis, an expert on dry stones who spends long hours up there and who would be happy to tell you all about the history behind them.

What a better way to look out over our beautiful county town and the surrounding landscapes, from the foothills to the high peaks of the Pyrenees?

Behind the scenes of "Foix, Terre d'Histoire"

Every summer for over 60 years, an amazing group effort brings the town of Foix to life. 150 volunteers take you through the great history of this medieval city and its surrounding territory. Dazzling sound and light shows will reveal some of its secrets to you!

"Foix, Terre d'Histoire" (Land of History) is testament to the huge enthusiasm of the volunteers who are so proud of what they achieve year after year.

"From the young Gaspard, 3 years old, to the elders at 86 years old, everyone is included whatever their role: technical, costume making, set design, performers...or all three at the same time and even more!" says Laëtitia Lafon, Co-president of the volunteer association.

This creates an impressive show where the history of Ariège mixes with local legends and the fairies of Fontestorbes. A year and a half of work, 120 participants, around 500 costumes and, more than ever before, "the joy of gathering with friends, with their "summer family" around values of solidarity and the desire to do good", adds Laëtitia.

"Foix, Terre d'Histoire" comes to life in the heights of the town, from a lush green theatre with the Château de Foix as a backdrop. Thanks to the work of the volunteers who are all so proud to share this wonderful story with the public.

Yes, a little over 10 years ago, after a completely different professional life, I started breeding Limousin and Brown Alpine cows following a 'calf-withmother' veal production method (Label Rouge®) and I was quite successful! Now I'm starting another project, to make cheese matured with hay.

DO YOU HAVE AN EDUCATIONAL ROLE?


Of course! I am completely self-taught. I learned my trade by making mistakes and by getting inspired by those who knew how to do it.

When people come to me, I help them to understand that when you

do your job well, the product is good. I put a little bit of understanding and a human touch back into a profession that is sometimes misunderstood by consumers.

HOW WOULD YOU DEFINE YOUR LOVE OF THE REGION?

Infinite! There are always things to do or see, no matter where you are. It's a beautiful, green region. It's a land of regeneration, where you can settle down, recharge your batteries and feel fresh again when you leave. I discover a little more about it every day.









Focus on

WHITE BEER OR «WITBIER» FROM THE BRASSERIE LA FOURCHE

A fresh, delicate beer with a final note of ginger. A beer made with great passion and brewed in the centre of Foix.

RIMONTAIS CHEESE FROM THE MILLES FARM IN RIMONT

This small, particularly tasty goat's cheese keeps for a long time; making it taste even better!

SALTED BUTTER CARAMEL FROM VIRIDIANA IN MONTOULIEU

A delicious plain caramel with hazelnuts or chocolate that everyone wants to try... even our Breton friends! It really warrants the detour!

COUNTRY HAM FROM GAEC DE LA COUMES IN SAINT MARTIN DE CARALP

This seasoned raw ham matured for 7 months is a pure delight. When shredded by hand it tastes even better.

Eat well, eat locally!

THE LOCAL GROCERY SHOP

The idea first came from a volunteer/communitybased story. A «Drive thru farm shop» opened at the start of lockdown when everything around was closing. Naturally, it developed into a grocery shop on top of a trailer made from scratch by Timour Roche, a wonderful cabinetmaker. Today, it plays host to 130 local producers and there are 1300 products to taste (some of which are from outside Ariège in the «épicerie d'ailleurs»). Above all, it has a functional role for the local economic fabric and is an exciting adventure!

Once upon a time in Foix... the Friday morning market

Going to the Foix market on Friday mornings means giving yourself over to sensories pleasures and really local products. The sounds, the smells, the tastes, the buzz. an authentic market.


The "allées de Villote" and the "halle aux Grains"

Allow yourself to be transported by these long alleys in the shade of plane trees. The colours, sounds and varied stalls will guide you. Lively exchanges between people pay testament to our local culture.

At the top of the alleys, you will meet the sisters from the Abbaye du Pesquié, producers of raw milk cheeses, home-made jams and gingerbread.

Continue along Rue Bayle and Rue des Marchands taking you into the heart of the town and follow the sound of the locals' shopping caddies rolling along the cobblestones. Passersby smile as street musicians play tunes and the bells of the abbey ring out.

Take a gourmet break at the Passe Temps, a tea room on the Place au Beurre.



Place Saint Volusien

A delightful square, this is the second place not to be missed at the market. A festival of different aromas will lead you through: fruit, vegetables, country bread, charcuterie, cheeses are all enticing invitations to meet with local producers.

You may come across Michel Fauré, restaurateur from the Saint Michel in Varilhes, who will tell you that the secrets to his flavours are all to be found here on these stalls with their high quality products.

11:30 am, the bells of Saint Volusien ring out. Don't be shy, follow the Foix locals into the heart of the abbey church. It's time for the market concert which takes place every Friday morning, a timeless musical break. End your morning with lunch in the medieval city. You really are spoilt for choice!

An authentic Azinat

MICHEL FAURÉ FROM THE SAINT MICHEL IN VARILHES

who you already met at the Foix market this morning, now shares his recipe for azinat, a cabbage soup, a real local gastronomic gem.

PREPARATION


Wash the cabbage thoroughly. Blanch it for 5 minutes. Prepare the roux with the onions, peeled carrots and a little duck

fat, add the end of the ham, the saucisson and the bay leaf.
Cover with 3.5 litres of water. When it boils, leave to cook for 30 minutes, add the cabbage. Continue cooking for 1 hour 30 minutes.

• Prepare the rouzole, in a large bowl, put in the sausage meat, lardons, eggs, garlic, chopped parsley and the breadcrumbs soaked in milk and drained, add pepper without salt, mix everything together, shape the stuffing. Add the potatoes, the confit drained of fat and place the rouzole on top, continue cooking for 30 minutes.

Azinat is eaten hot. The broth is served with thin slices of bread. Serve the meat, vegetables and sliced rouzole.

- · 850g firm potatoes
- · 250g smoked lardons

"A little slice of paradise"



Tonight, another round at the Bon Gaillard!

The heat of the day is starting to subside, it's pleasant and everyone wants to enjoy it. Our advice: phone a few friends and meet at the summer HQ: the Bon Gaillard.

Delphine and Gilles took over the Roucateille campsite in January 2021. They have transformed it into a little slice of paradise where friendship and togetherness are the key words.

The Bon Gaillard is a wine bar on this campsite in Montgailhard, a small village just a stone's throw from the town of Foix, but not only that... In fact, it is a very friendly place, where locals and tourists meet and talk about the places not to be missed here. Sometimes 2 or 3 little secrets that are well kept by our locals slip out after a couple of glasses.

By the way, the wine list provided by our hosts is as high-quality as it is varied.

And for those of you who are not in the know (and yes, it happens!), you won't be neglected! A variety of artisanal drinks will help you discover the savoirfaire and creativity of our region.

This place is so pleasant that people always gather here. An evening at the Bon Gaillard is also a great opportunity to sample local specialities. This evening, the menu is 'from the producer to the plate', with home-made burgers from the Ferme du Vignoble.

The evening rolls on before the sunset show starts above the pool and Pic de Montgailhard.



Blueberry picking on the farm

You wake up with your family in a gîte in the heart of the Barguillère. You open the shutters onto the Picou, which acts as a lookout for the habitants of the valley. The morning sun's rays light up sleepy hamlets one by one. One of them happens to be Malpassadou in Brassac. This is the anchor point for your day.

Head for the farm of the same name where Franck is waiting to share his world with you: blueberries. A tightly woven wicker basket from the Foix market is perfect for picking this woodland berry because in this farm with its stone buildings, it is up to you to pick your own blueberries! Once your basket is full, stop at the shop for a natural fruit juice. Then continue on the road to the Col de Légrillou to enjoy the peace and quiet and the view. Be careful not to stay there too long or your fragile harvest might overheat! Back at the gîte for 3pm, it's time for a snack: you guessed it, it is blueberry tart. Just in time to preheat the oven to 180°, roll out a shortcrust pastry and top it with these small fruits (if the children haven't scoffed them all on the way). Bake for 40 minutes. It's four o'clock and it's time! Serve everyone a glass of fruit juice and a piece of pie. A delicious experience to share with the whole family.

OBSERVE

Ariège provides a journey into the heart of nature, a succession of large natural areas, a protective oasis for the rich fauna and flora. Explore them, feel them and experience a timeless interlude!



Far from the crowd, the open air

Focus on... the fauna and flora of the Parc Naturel Régional des Pyrénées Ariégeoises.

The town of Foix became the gateway to this natural park in 2019. As soon as you arrive, you are at the entrance to the Parc Naturel Régional and, more precisely, to the Barguillère valley, which is about fifteen kilometres long from east to west, including nine municipalities.

The Parc Naturel Régional is aimed at responding to the major challenges of sustainable development and in particular to the preservation of living heritage, a crucial, coordinated drive for our region.





The red kite

As soon as spring arrives it is not uncommon to see this beautiful diurnal bird of prey with its reddish-brown plumage hovering over its prey. The species is better protected than ever before. Around 700 birds have been identified in Ariège and almost forty kites take refuge in the Brassac roosting area.

The Col des Marrous cep

Thanks to the diversity of its trees and the favourable soils, nearly 800 species of mushroom have been identified in the forests of the Barguillère. Among them, the famous and particularly tasty Col des Marrous cep. Beware of following advice from the habitants of the valley, they'll most probably send you in the wrong direction to keep the key ingredient of their precious cep omelettes for themselves! At the beginning of autumn, the cars parked by the roadside will be a useful clue...


The blueberry

In spring, at the foot of beech trees, small purple berries are born and then fought over by gourmands. But man has some competition as this precious berry is also a favourite with animals: grouse, deer and dahu all compete for this much-loved fruit!

The desman

Also known as the «rat-trumpet» because of the shape of its snout, the desman is a small mammal, emblematic of the Pyrenees. An endemic species, it is now threatened with extinction. The Conservatoire Régional des Espaces Naturels (CREN) is doing everything it can to prevent its disappearance.

Van Life in Prat d'Albis

In the distance, the lights of the villages start to switch on. The last paragliders land and their air-filled wings fold. The first stars appear. In the van, the rear doors are left open overlooking a valley that seems never to end.

After taking in the beauty of your chosen spot for the evening, set up your dining room under the stars: two chairs and a folding table, simple but practical. An ideal chance to taste your bounty from this morning's market: sausage, cheese, bread... In all their simple splendour.

Then time stops. Let yourself drift away into the moment, free, in the midst of a world that belongs to you.



After sport comes relaxation!



When you arrive in the village, take the footpath after the picnic area at the side of the road and walk along the small stream. The sound of the water guides you, awakening your senses. You pass under three jagged rocks before reaching a promontory where you can look out on the ruins of an old farmhouse called the Parisian's cabin. After a narrow passage, there's a spectacular panorama of the valley and of the Montgailhard sugar loaf. This might be a good time to have your picnic and enjoy the open air. After replenishing your strength, get ready for the descent through the woods. A few hundred metres further down, take a small path back to your starting point. After this big hike, it's time to rest! It's a good idea to relax those muscles before they cool down. For this, why not go to the aquatic centre in Foix and use its various facilities. After a refreshing swim in the pool, head for the wellness area. The jacuzzi, sauna and hammam are all there to give you a moment of relaxation. A jam packed day that's good for your mind and your body!





Follow in the slipstream of the Tour de France

"Ready?"

Ariège is a land cherished by cyclists and the Tour de France riders won't disagree. Highly-prized by enthusiasts and often feared by champions, the Ariège stage is widely renowned. Are you ready?

If you are an experienced rider, then there is no doubt about it: you must take on the Mur de Péguère. If you overcome that, you'll pass over the Col des Marrous and finish at the bottom in a pretty green valley before returning to Foix. With 1520 metres of altitude difference and 70 kilometres in this challenging loop, some sections reach a 16% gradient. It is best to be well prepared! In 2017, 2019 and again this year, the Ariège stage of the Tour will pass through here before arriving in Foix. This col has become legendary. Another circuit, and no slouch, is Les Trois Bosses (the three humps). Here, the difficulty rises in crescendo. You start with the warm-up in Montoulieu, then the Col de Traucadou with its 10.5 kilometres of climbing before rounding off with the Bout de Touron above Prat d'Albis, the stage's finish line in the 2019 Tour de France. Does all this frighten you off or are you just more into gentle rides? No problem! Head for the green route (Voie Verte) from Foix. This former railway line reserved for pedestrians, bicycles and horses takes you to all the way to Saint Girons. It is 44 kilometres long and you can turn back whenever you want... Saddle up!

In search of a gold rush!

Who would have thought? When we think of the gold rush, our minds often take us to wild, distant American lands. But panning for gold, particularly in Ariège, has been around for much longer. Portrait of a leisure activity rich in excitement.

Gold panning is one of those unusual activities to be found on the Ariège river. Indeed, its Latin name "Aurigera" speaks for itself: "which carries gold".

As soon as the days start getting longer, become an amateur gold digger for a day and enjoy the thrill of looking for the metal that makes dreams come true: gold!

"It's also about connecting with nature"

says David Bruno, a passionate gold panner.

Because the Salat river, the only place open to the activity, is a protected playground.

"Gold panning in the river is done from 1 May to 31 October, to preserve the well-being of its biodiversity. This is why a permit is needed.

I often say that we find a little bit of gold and a lot of dreams["], he adds.

One thing is for sure, you'll have a great time.




Canoeing and kayaking, flagship activities

The Rébech basin!





These beauties are shy... After several casts you feel a slight «twitch» at the end of your fingers and your line dives. You've caught something! Despite all the excitement, you manage to bring in your catch. Like magic: a brown trout! If its sides are golden and its back is dotted with black and red spots then there's no doubt, it's a trout! You quickly take your camera out of your bag to capture the moment. Then it's time to gently return it into the river. Putting such a beautiful fish back in the water, setting it free again, is an unforgettable experience!

After loading the rafts on the trailer, step aboard the minibus to your starting point at Ferrières-sur-Ariège. After listening to their advice and the safety debrief, you are ready for your mission: taking on the turbulent waters of the Ariège over the three-kilometre course! You will be kitted out with: a life jacket, helmet and a wetsuit. Raring to go, you give the first paddle strokes some gusto. For nearly an hour and a half, navigate rapids with your experienced guide and enjoy the sheer exhilaration, and a few surprises along the way. Take on the exciting challenge of negotiating the rapids under safe supervision. A moment of pure joy in the middle of nature with your friends. A great way to discover Ariège from the water...

Art speaks even if we don't always know how to explain it. It appeals to our emotions, feelings and intuition. But most of all, it spreads... and Ariège is no exception to this! " Knowledge can transform a material"



Arts and crafts, age-old disciplines

Generation after generation, art is the legacy of crafts which must never be forgotten. Skills that have been developed, tested, sometimes lost and then found again, and finally mastered. Specific knowledge can transform a material, giving it all different forms, whatever the way.

FOCUS ON TWO CRAFTS

Ceramics

Clay lies at the bottom of our rivers so it's no coincidence that people were inspired to work with this substance and its various virtues.

In Ariège, you will find a strong tradition of pottery and ceramics, crafts that make each work a unique piece. Decorated and then glazed using a method specific to each one, the piece is then meticulously fired to harden it. Pieces designed to stand the test of time!

Stained glass

We often imagine stained glass windows decorating churches, telling a thousand epic stories in shimmering colours but this art form can also be found in the intimacy of our own homes.

Combining tradition and modernity, anything can be depicted, far beyond the realms of religion. The glass is cut, painted, fired then set with lead and copper, the results are only limited by your own imagination...



Julie Frilley et Dimikev, vital art

Julie is a ceramist. She sculpts «clay and other things». Dimikev is a wood and metal sculptor. They now live in Montoulieu and are inviting us in to share their creativity.

WHY DID YOU SETTLE IN ARIÈGE?

Julie: My family lives in Ariège. I have always been in love with the region. It's my home, where I feel good physically and as a person. I belong here.

Dimikev: I come from Reims. I left to explore France and Ariège stopped me. It has everything I want: nature, greenery, a wild aspect... and a very human side.

WHERE DO YOU FIND YOUR INSPIRATION?

J: I let it go. It's not necessarily rational. I like the imaginary, the world of dreams, comics, POP, colour, hybrid characters, street art... that's what comes to me. I often think about it after the sculptures are created.

D: My approach is very intuitive. Whether it's wood or metal, I let the material guide to inspire me. I see things in it and then reveal them. I always try to create a dynamic that goes upwards and with lightness.

ARE THERE ANY LIMITATIONS TO YOUR ART?

J: Limitations are inherent to the material. You have to accept it. You just have to understand what happened and love an imperfect piece as it is. I am often asked why I hollow out my sculptures. Yes, there are other methods but I like to work on something solid and then on its lightness. I like to take these constraints on board and see them in a different light.

D: I work with constraints. That's what makes my work because I don't force anything, on wood or on metal. I give them renewed value. I go along with their limitations and their forms. I listen to the material.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO ANSWER A QUESTION THAT WE HAVEN'T ASKED?

J: I would like to talk about the creative process and the notion of time. Because art is about releasing control. We live in an age where everything has to go fast. Us, we live in patience, with the process of creating a sculpture.

D: When you are a sculptor, there is no difference between your personal life and your professional life. We are 100% committed. Our emotions, our feelings are transcribed into the material. It's a question of balance that must be maintained in order to create. That is vital!




2 ENJOY THE VIEWPOINT AT MONTOULIEU




6 HEAR THE ORGAN OF THE CHURCH OF SAINT-VOLUSIEN

Nicolas Gardel is a trumpet player who needs no introduction in the jazz world. With a classical music diploma in his pocket, he discovered a whole new world at the age of 18, the music of the southern United States. An epiphany! That's what he wanted to do. A Toulouse native but from Ariège on his father's side, he knows the region very well. THE RESTAURANT LA CIBOULETTE


"200 metres from my house, this is a must. The chef's cuisine is refined, home-made, eco-friendly and the flavours come from all over the world."
